









2A Trails Committee Host Open House on November 28

5:30pm to 6:30pm at Centennial Hall

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, COLORADO-November 20, 2017-The City of Steamboat Springs 2A trails committee will host a 2A Trails Project Open House on Tuesday, November 28 in partnership with the Trail Maintenance Endowment Fund. Local U.S. Forest Service and Trail Maintenance Endowment Fund staff will be in attendance.

The informational event will provide updates on completed 2A funded trail projects, 2A funded trail construction planned for 2018, the Parks, Recreation, Open Space, Trails and River Master Plan update, and the upcoming Forest Service NEPA planning process, which will determine new trail opportunities in the Mad Creek, Rocky Peak, and Rabbit Ears Pass areas.

Centennial Hall (124 10th Street) hosts the open house outlining the future of trails in

Steamboat Springs centered on the 2A community efforts. The open house will run from 5:30PM to 6:30PM.

In November of 2013, the voters of Steamboat Springs approved a portion of the municipal accommodations tax to develop trails. Over the next ten years \$5.1 million dollars are planned to be invested in trail infrastructure across Steamboat Springs. A committee, made up of Steamboat Springs' residents, is prioritizing the expenditures of this investment.
