



Utility Project Brings Lane Closure To Oak Street

Westbound Lane Between 11th And 12th Streets Closed to Traffic This Week

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, COLORADO-July 14, 2025-The City of Steamboat Springs will continue utility work this week to move overhead utility lines underground. Similar projects in the past focused on Yampa Street and the alley located between Lincoln Avenue and Yampa Street.

This year, the city is working to underground the overhead utility lines within the alley located between Lincoln Avenue and Oak Street. Beginning on Tuesday, July 15, the westbound lane of Oak Street will be closed between 11th and 12th Streets. The lane closure will only impact Oak Street, and two-way traffic will continue to flow on 11th and 12th Streets.

Eastbound traffic along Oak Street will remain open to allow access to the residences on the south side of the street. There will be no alternating traffic along the open lane, and vehicles traveling westbound on Oak Street will need to follow detour signage around the closure.



The westbound lane closure will be in effect Tuesday (7/14) through Friday (7/18), then the lane will reopen at the end-of-day Friday for the weekend. Additional closures may be necessary the following week depending on how the project progresses.

This recent phase of the utility undergrounding project began in early June in the alley between the Old West Building and Laundry/Creekside. These efforts will both advance utility service reliability and help beautify the alley by removing the overhead utility lines. This phase of the project is expected to last one year, and the work is being performed by Advanced Electrical Contracting Inc.
